It's Winter! What Better Time to Read a Book?

If you saw the painting, "Luncheon of the Boating Party" by Pierre Auguste Renoir at the Phoenix Art Museum a couple of years ago and, like me, fell in love with it, then I know you will want to read the novel that recently came out by Susan Vreeland entitled "Luncheon of the Boating Party" and sporting a picture of the painting itself on the cover.

I suppose it goes without saying that this novel is about the trials and tribulations of Renoir as he conceived the idea for the painting and set out to execute it. It was a very unusual painting for the time, since it required so many models. It all took place on successive Sunday afternoons in the summer of 1880 on a cafe terrace overlooking the Seine River near Paris. Renoir had had some success with his painting in the impressionist style and acquired name recognition but not the monetary success that he needed to live the good life. He called in all the favors he could from his friends and acquaintances to come up with the models for the painting, which he did not sketch in advance, but used blotches and smears of paint to mark his canvas as he went along. He did not have the money for the paints and the giant canvas on which he painted it, but his old friend



and art supplier gave him the supplies and "put it on his tab" (much to the chagrin of the supplier's wife).

Also of interest in the story are the relationships among the other impressionist painters of the time. Impressionism was not yet an accepted method of painting, which is one of the reasons Renoir had not achieved the monetary success he sought.

I did not find this book quite as compelling as some of Vreeland's prior novels, such as "Girl in Hyacinth Blue" and "The Passion of Artemisia." However, I would recommend it as an interesting view on the beginnings of the impressionist stayle of painting and Paris in the late 1800's.
