


I hope you all liked our cover this issue. I got permission from AutoWeek Magazine to use the photo on the cover of their October 31, 2011 is-


# Dates: September 10 & 11th Number of cars in caravan: 7 - one met us there





## Sunday September 11 th

We traveled to our meeting place to pay and meet our guide. The Juessens and the Redfords took a shorter tour with a different tour guide, and departed before us. The access road was the actual wash that the water runs through when it rains and can reach depths up to 2 feet.

The tour is located on Navajo land near Page, Arizona. Antelope Canyon includes two separate, photogenic slot canyon sections, referred to individually as Upper Antelope Canyon or The Crack; and Lower Antelope Canyon or The Corkscrew. Antelope Canyon is the place where Britney Spears shot her "I'm not a girl, not yet a woman" video, as well as the filiming location for many scenes from the 1996 motion picture "Broken Arrow."

Antelope Canyon has been open to the public since 1997, when the Navajo Tribe turned it into a Navajo Tribal Park. It's famous for being a place that trans-






The '73 model year has always been a favorite for us. We had an orange '73 shortly after we were married and raced/ralleyed it when we lived in Columbus with the Central Buckeye Corvette Association, sponsored by Bob McDorman Chevrolet.

We found this coupe in Dana Point with its owner of 31 years. He kept meticulous records of everything done to the car including the engine and driveline rebuilt about 15,000 miles ago. The cosmetics are good and the mechanics solid, but we're redoing some of the interior, getting the engine bay tidied up and doing some serious bushing, brakes and suspension work to get things up to snuff. It's an L48 4-speed that was tweaked up a bit with a cam, heads and pistons during the rebuild and is one of the few C3's we looked at across the Southwest with working AC - - something of a must for us out here.

We miss the Precision Red C6 that we enjoyed for five years, but really expect to enjoy this "old school" car that sorta suits its old school owners!

I can't give you any facts, figures or statistics. Other than watching these zillion horsepower machines run a quarter mile at speeds between 200 and 300 MPH, I had absolutely




